



Sermon Discussion Guide

January 19, 2025 | Psalm 11-14 | Jerrod

SUMMARY

Covering 4 Psalms at once can be a challenge. Though each Psalm is different, there are overlapping themes, as well as a progression of thought. These theologically-rich prayerful words share David's wrestling and response to his enemies, discerning and responding to evil and wicked people, hope and trust in the Lord - His character (11:4-7), His Word (12:6-7), His justice and His timing (13:1-2), and His sure-coming deliverance (14:7.)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

2 Options:

Option #1.

For an open discussion with those who were able to listen to the sermon, work through each person in your group, asking the following 2 questions:

In light of the sermon on Psalm 11-14,

1. What did God say to you?
2. What are you going to do about it?

Option #2.

If some or most of the folks in your group *did not* hear the sermon, it may be pretty daunting to work through all 4 with your group's time constraints, so I recommend you **pick one Psalm** and work through the following:

1. Read the Psalm
2. What seems to be the main point? How do you know?
3. What does this psalm teach us to be true about God, Mankind, and the world?
4. How do those truths impact the affections and dispositions of your heart? (How does the psalm prompt and encourage you toward love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control)
5. How does this Psalm help you understand Christ and the Gospel?
6. What is the Lord, through this Psalm, calling you to do?
