### PAUL'S LETTER TO THE ROMANS



### Structure

Ch. 1–3 – Universal Sinfulness: All have sinned and fall short.

Ch. 4–5 – Justification by Faith: Abraham as the model of saving faith.

Ch. 6–8 – Sanctification and New Life: Victory over sin, life in the Spirit.

Ch. 9–11 – God's Sovereign Election: Israel and the purposes of God.

Ch. 12–15 – Christian Living: Ethical exhortations and love.

Ch. 16 – Greetings and Final Words: Commendations and unity.

### Author Paul Paulos

- A former Pharisee turned Apostle to the Gentiles.
- Authored Romans under the influence and inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
- Writes a very precise, logical, and theologically filled letter while maintaining a pastor's heart.

### Date AD 54-58

- Written during the third missionary journey and likely from the city of Corinth. (Acts 20:2-3)
- Delivered to Rome by Phoebe, a servant in the church from Cenchreae (Romans. 16:1-2)

### Genre Epistle (Letter)

### History & Purpose

- Rome was the capital of the empire — politically powerful, culturally diverse, and religiously pluralistic.
- The church in Rome was likely founded by Jewish believers (perhaps present at Pentecost, Acts 2:10).
- Jewish Christians were expelled under Claudius (Acts 18:2), and when they returned, tensions arose between Jewish and Gentile believers — which helps explain some of Paul's emphasis on unity (Romans 14–15).
- Christians in Rome faced social pressure, marginalization, and the looming threat of persecution under Nero (shortly after the letter was written).

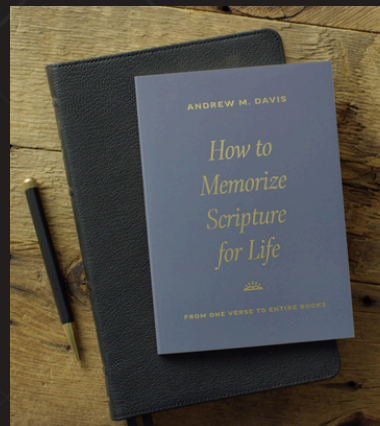

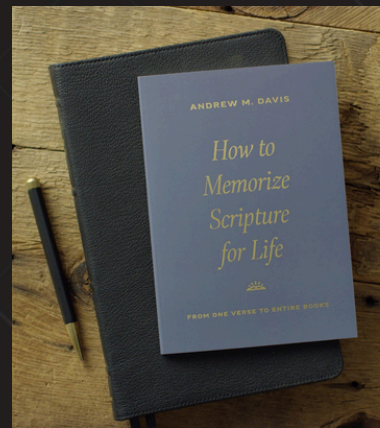
